Situation Overview

- WHAT: Slight RISK of severe weather Main Threats:
 - Damaging Winds with storms
 - Tornadoes
 - Heavy Rainfall (Flash Flood Watch in effect)
 - Minor Coastal Flooding
- WHERE: Slight RISK over Southeast Louisiana and Southern Mississippi
- WHEN: This afternoon through Wednesday morning

Today's Timeline:

Individual storms could be severe this afternoon and evening. A squall line of strong to severe storms is expected overnight into Wednesday morning.

Severe Weather Threats:

- Tornadoes (mainly in late afternoon and evening)
- Strong damaging winds
- Heavy rainfall of 2-4" with locally higher amounts










Wednesday Morning






Wednesday morning






Tornado Threat






Damaging Wind Threat






Large Hail Threat

Current Watches/Warnings



Summary of Impacts

- Slight to Enhanced Risk of Severe Storms
 - Tornado threat still exist this afternoon through this evening
 - Damaging winds and tornado threat exist tonight into Wednesday morning
- Heavy Rainfall and Flash Flooding Possible through Tuesday night through Wednesday morning
 - 2-4" of rain with locally higher amounts possible
 - Flash Flood Watch has been issued for outlook area through Wednesday morning
- Above normal tides
 - Tides 1 to 1.5 ft above normal could result in minor/nuisance flooding of low lying areas
