










Saturday Rainfall






- Heaviest rains expected over SW Mississippi and Baton Rouge area.
- Afternoon and evening hours will see heaviest rains.
- Rainfall of 2 to 3 inches expected with locally higher amounts to 5 inches possible.



Saturday Flash Flood Potential










Sunday Rainfall






- Heaviest rains expected

- Heavy rains possible through the day.
- Rainfall of 2 to 4 inches expected with locally higher amounts to 6 inches possible.



Sunday Flash Flood Potential








3 Day Rainfall Forecast Today through Monday morning









Tides





Tides will be one half to a foot above normal. This may slow drainage slightly, but no significant impacts expected.





Summary



- Widespread rain with embedded thunderstorms will develop tomorrow and continue into Sunday. Heavy rains will be possible both Saturday and Sunday.
- Flash flood watch in effect from late tonight through 7 pm Sunday. 3-5" rainfall with locally higher amounts of 6-8" possible. Heaviest rains will occur where storms train over the same location.
 - Heaviest rains will fall over SW MS and the Baton Rouge area on Saturday. Heaviest rains will fall along and south of the I-10 corridor on Sunday.
 - Tides will be above normal by one half foot to one foot.
 - Rains will linger into Monday and Tuesday, but heavy rainfall is not expected those days.
 - Severe thunderstorms will not be a threat with this storm system.
