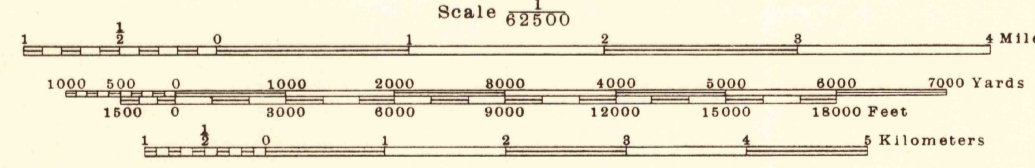

Datum is mean gulf level at Biloxi, Mississippi. Elevations differ from mean sea level elevations as determined by the U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey by small fractions of a foot.
